We take your privacy on the Internet very seriously, and this document explains what personal data we capture and how we use it.

Information

We collect two types of information from site users: personal data (including names and e-mail addresses); and statistical data (e.g. how many users use the site, and which pages they view).

Personal Data

This is only captured when you provide it to us such as when you fill in the contact form and submit it to us. It will be shared with the Innovation Network partners unless you otherwise. We will send you emails containing news and information about the Innovation Network Programme and other Innovation Information that we feel you will be interested in. You may unsubscribe from our email at any time.

Statistical Data

We may log your IP address as you browse the site. This is purely for website statistics, recording the users to the site and which pages they visit.

Data Protection

The Innovation Network seeks to comply with the UK Data Protection Act 1998 and the GDPR of May 2018. We follow strict security procedures in the storage and disclosure of personal information so as to prevent unauthorised access by third parties. We will never share your information with other parties.

The information which you may provide on this website, along with other information relating to you, will be held by the Innovation Network and used for general business purposes. This information will not be passed to third parties. By providing your contact details to the Innovation Network you consent to all of the above uses.

How we use cookies

A cookie is a small file which asks permission to be placed on your computer's hard drive. Once you agree, the file is added and the cookie helps analyse web traffic or lets you know when you visit a particular site. Cookies allow web applications to respond to you as an individual. The web application can tailor its operations to your needs, likes and dislikes by gathering and remembering information about your preferences.

We use traffic log cookies to identify which pages are being used. This helps us analyse data about web page traffic and improve our website in order to tailor it to customer needs. We only use this information for statistical analysis purposes and then the data is removed from the system.

Overall, cookies help us provide you with a better website, by enabling us to monitor which pages you find useful and which you do not. A cookie in no way gives us access to your computer or any information about you, other than the data you choose to share with us.
